Programs

North Shore Reads, the joint program with other local libraries, will be held on Thursday March 26th at the Metropolitan in Glen Cove. The book is Alice Hoffman's Museum of extraordinary things; Ms. Hoffman will be a guest speaker at our event.

Buildings and grounds
